Message from the President



The sense of relief can only be derived from the pride of success.

It is with humble pride of success that I am penning this message on this occasion which simultaneously marks my two - decade long administrative journey at the BASL coming to an end. The pride of success can only be realized through hard work, perseverance. dedication and determination. It is not ordinary effort that suffices but an extraordinary endeavor that is required. Time is golden, but it is the products of time which are treasured. Not every plan is fool-proof; the success depends on as to how the unforeseen is coped with.

During my Induction Speeches as the President of the BASL in the last two years, I acknowledged the importance of performing our task with appropriate knowledge, skills and attitude, which can only be imparted by giving a proper training to our Law Students and Apprentices and our Colleagues. To this end. the BASL offered various certificate courses such as Criminal Defense, Effective Instructina Attornevs. Advanced Training on ICT. Legal English and so forth. Not to mention a plethora of one day CLE programs targeting every dimension of the law which were organized across the country. Two batches of Apprentices, in the eve of their Big day of being called to the Bar, after being reminded of the certain fundamental core values which were to be adhered to and preserved in the legal profession were distributed their BASL ID cards, enabling them to engage in their professional duties from the first day of stepping into the legal arena.

BASL pioneered in enhancing not only the knowledge of the young lawyers, but also their vocal and presentation skills, which is a sine qua non for legal professionals discharging duties at any forum. Accordingly for the first time in the history, BASL partnered with HNB Toastmaster International to offer 'Speech Craft program' which afforded an amiable avenue for the young lawyers to brush aside their stage phobia and brace their confidence to fearlessly to present their views in the presence of an audience.

I also emphasize that the Legal Education system across the board was not standardized and that the Bar Association should take necessary steps to remedy the situation. Accordingly we deemed it an exigency to ensure the people who enter into this noble profession are above the threshold of the particular standard which preserves the solemnity of the legal profession. In line with this perception, a Committee headed by Mr. Ali Sabry, PC was appointed, mandated to propose the necessary reforms. I am proud to state that they have done a remarkable job and prepared a comprehensive report with the help of senior and junior colleagues of the Bar, which was submitted to the Incorporated Council of Legal Education. Before the end of my tenure we were able to further shove it through the hierarchy that it has already received the nod of

approval from all stake holders thus it will be only a matter of time before the suggestions included therein are implemented.

Once the propositions presented through the said report are schemed out, not only uncontrollable amount of entry into the profession will be curtailed to filter the cream of intellect out into the profession but also those who have been called to the Bar will be constantly monitored and guided along the righteous course.

One of my long standing dreams of decentralizing the National Law Conference to bring it closer to the membership has been manifested. I took pride in affirming the fulfillment of the said desire which saw 05 Provincial Law Conferences being organized across Sri Lanka during my first year. The overwhelming positive response which arose from the members of the Bar who had benefited out of the novel initiative. only hardened my determination into making it a steady practice. As a result 05 more Provincial Law Conferences saw the light of the day during the outgoing year in 2018 with the Assistance of the USAID. The presence of his Lordship Justice Padman Soorasena and Mr. Jayantha Jayasooriya PC, Hon. Attorney General of Sri Lanka drew a tremendous turn out at every such conference. It is my duty to thank Mr. Mitch Gruner, Ms. Shirani Narayana, Ms. Kushangika and Mr. Yasith Samarakoon and also to Mrs. Nayomi Wickramarathne Attorney-At-Law. Mr. Prakalathan Thuraisingam, Mr. Kalinga De Silva for their service to ensure success of this project. We entrusted the Bars of the particular province with the organizing their own Provincial Law Conference with a particular heed to focus on the peculiar issues they faced with. The success of the Provincial Law

Conferences is amply demonstrated by the Bars calling out for opportunity to organize it in their respective provinces, more than once.

A mesmerizing highlight of the past year was the 'National Law Week' whose main event, for the first time in the BASL history, was orchestrated in a premise outside Hulftsdorp. Accordingly at the invitation of BASL. Mr. Madura Withanage Attorney-At-Law. Hon. Mayor of Javawardenapura Municipal Council joined force with the BASL to take the 'National Law Week' to Jayawardenapura Municipal ground where a massive Legal Aid Clinic was organized on 30th June and 1st of July 2018 which was well responded by a unprecedented volume of people gushing, in seeking quality legal advice. The most senior President's Counsel down the way to all other legal practitioners were benevolent enough to dedicate some of their time off their busy schedule so as to guench the thirst of people by offering their expert opinion free of charge. A number of Government Institutions also flocked together at the same premise to advance the idea of 'Access to Justice' promoted by the BASL. In parallel to the main event, Legal Aid Clinics were held across the country under the patronage of respective Bars. The 'National Law Week' was further featured by Awareness Programs aimed at alerting the minds of the school children of the risk they have been exposed with the growing technology in the country and the precautions to be taken to avoid the booby traps laid on the less-regulated cyber space.

The practice of publishing the latest Unreported Judgments in view of the delay it takes to release the official version of Sri Lanka Law Reports continued uninterruptedly during the past years as well. Accordingly the General Publication Committee

headed by Mr. Kasun Liyanage Attorney-At-Law compiled Appellate Court Judgments in 2018 (unreported) for Criminal Law in two volumes. We also offered the whole set of Sri Lanka Law Reports at an affordable price which we had allowed to settle in easy monthly installments. Most importantly for the first time in the history we were able to print National Law Report (NLR) in collaboration with Government Printer and Sri Lanka Law Reports for our membership. In this regard the role played by Mr. Vijitha Manamperi Attorney-At-Law iin cordinating the relevant authorities muct be Particularly acknowledged.

The re-launch of the BASL website was a remarkable achievement which merits a quick flashback. The earlier BASL official Website had become virtually 'handicapped' due to a myriad of issues therefore it became an exigency to draw up a new website which could cater our requirements. Accordingly with the help of a permanent IT Executive of the BASL a new and user-friendly website with the full administrative capacity vested in BASL was developed, which was commissioned on the cyber space Though the BASL website is still in the process of being upgraded to function to its fully capacity, I am positive that the foundation stone laid down during my tenure will point to an impregnable pathway for it to flourish to a fully-fledged website which can bring many services to the finger tips of the membership, including voting at future BASL elections.

I vehemently spoke of improvements to the infrastructure facilities of the Court houses. I turned my word into action when I was the first President to participate in the Infrastructure Trust Fund Committee. By my intervention I was able to provide equipment needed to outstation Bars. Further we selected 25 Bars with the approval of the EXCO and help them to improve

their infrastructure facilities.

BASL as a responsible professional body intervened in issues which assumed national importance. Accordingly it raised its concern over the duplicity of proposed Constitution, the threat to independency and integrity of the judiciary and legal profession and made representation in assisting the apex Court in interpreting the Constitution and determining the constitutionality of the Bills. The BASL took a firm stand against whomsoever regardless of the stature seeking to insult the legal profession in furtherance of their clumsy political agenda. As a result we have already instituted actions against the individuals who had made remarks in public in derogation of our noble legal profession, motivated by conjecture and surmises.

Yet another concept I could introduce to the legal community was a grand-scale discourse with the participation of every stake holder in the administration of justice, titled 'Colombo Dialogue' under the theme 'We shall converse fearlessly'. Accordingly 'Colombo Dialoque' glamorously unfolded for two days, 23rd and 24th of March 2019, being dedicated for Civil and Criminal Law respectively. On the invitation of BASL and under the blessing of the Judicial Services Commission, Judges of Supreme Court namely his Lordship Justice Padman Soorasena. His Lordship Justice S. Thurairaja PC, Judges of Court of Appeal, namely his Lordship Justice Arjun Obeysekara PC, Judges of High Court, namely Mr. Manjula Thilakarathne, Judges of District Court and Magistrates namely Ms. Lanka Jayarathne, the Chief Magistrate of Colombo. Mr. Ranga Dissanayake, the Magistrate of Fort Magistrate Court. Most Senior President's Counsel, including the President elected Mr. Kalinga Indatissa, PC Senior Lawyers and

Junior Lawyers very enthusiastically took part in the event and bravely voiced their sentiments on the lapses manifested in the system and how it could be mended. As a result of the discourse. numerous innovative propositions were boosted, which the BASL is in the process of informing to the writing to the relevant authorities for implementation. All who attended the event vowed to continue with this new concept which was unanimously perceived to have embodied a colossal potential to bring about tangible changes to the law and system.

The outgoing year thus went by, marked by number of initiatives taken by BASL, some of which were shared above, and at the end of its calendar year hosted the 'Appreciation Night' on 15th March 2019, where Twenty Seventh senior lawyers who had completed 50 years in active service were felicitated while members who had contributed in various dimensions to raise the BASL up to the expectations of the membership were recognized by awarding them a very valuable 'Token of Appreciation'. The BASL which has never dispensed with the entertainment aspect of the members, during this year too, offered very attractive holiday package to 'Danauwwa Resort' accompanied by a few outdoor expeditions at a fraction of the actual price.

Finally with my tenure drawing to an end, an election was called for and I made it my bounden duty to ensure a free and fair election, without fear and favour. Accordingly the election to elect the next President and the Secretary of BASL was held on 20th February 2019 which was acclaimed as one of the most well-organized and configured elections in the recent past which was marked by the excellence of unbias and integrity. The BASL Election was headed to a new era when a successful initiative

was put into motion whereby the election results were displayed on a large screen then and there in front of the voting center at Colombo Court Complex. While the impartial and efficient role played by Mr. Dappula de Livera PC, Hon. Solicitor General of Sri Lanka as the Chief Returning Officer and his team must be specially commended, I would like to take this opportunity to convey my sincere regard and profound congratulation to my successor.

It is only a few initiatives taken by the BASL which were shared with you above and I must emphasize but for the commitment, dedication and perseverance of Standing Committees, Members of Executive Committee, Delegates of the Bar Council, all the members and permanent staff members of the BASL secretariat, the massive prosperity being experienced today would only be but a dream. Accordingly it is my duty to extend my sincere gratitude to all of them, particularly to the outgoing Deputy President, Mr. Ali Sabry PC, outgoing Treasurer, Mr. Sujeewa Lal Dahanayake Attorney-At-Law incumbent Secretary Mr. Kaushalya Nawarathne, Attorney-At-Law, incumbent Assistant Secretary Mr. Chamath Fernando Attorney-At-Law and Ms. Ruchira Gunasekara Attorney-At-Law in steering the BASL in an innovative and unprecedented way, by coordinating all relevant stake holders and motivating the members of Bar.

It is my duty to extend my profound compliment to Mr. G.G Arulpragasam, Senior Attorney-At-Law and my junior Mr. Kasun Liyanage, Attorney-At-Law and an executive member of BASL representing the junior members of the Bar for their unwavering corporation which undoubtedly always fuelled my determination to go higher than expected.

Before the end. I would like to take this opportunity to glance a quick hindsight at the way I travelled through during past two decades as an active member of BASL. My maiden Administrative post at the BASL was marked by my being elected to officiate in the Executive Committee in the year 2000 where I was tasked with rejuvenating the 'Welfare Committee' which eventually wrote history when I managed to bring the welfare facilities to the door step of Bars across the country. Then I was chosen to serve as Hon. Treasurer of BASL during 2002 - 2004 before I was voted to the office of Secretary in which capacity I served two years from 2008 to 2010. Finally in 2017 March I was elected to steer the BASL as its 24th President. Life at the BASL never proved to be a Bed of Roses for me and I had to encounter numerous hardships which I embraced as 'blessings in disguise' in order to fortify my determination and resolution to continue to fight the battle which I started way back in 2000. As I always remind, whatever I have done is not for myself but for the future generation. I first stepped into the BASL with a dream of steering it towards a New Era. Changing the direction of BASL alone did not satisfy me, so I wanted to glide on a voyage discovering New Horizons. Whenever I found a new horizon, my inner mind propelled me Beyond Horizons. Bevond Horizons where I found was the success. During first year I went, towards the Pinnacle. Today I am stepping down leaving the entire benefits of the said Pinnacle of Success to my Younger Generation.

Overview by the Secretary



I consider it to be a great honour and a privilege to serve you as the Secretary of the Bar Association of Sri Lanka for the year 2018/2019 and take an immense pride in presenting its annual report. The Annual Report consists of many activities carried out by the BASL during the year under review which has been commended by members and non members alike.

I shall endeavor to briefly appraise the membership with regard to the said activities of the BASL during the past year.

It is indeed a matter of concern over the years the overcrowding of the legal profession. The last year was not an exception to the said issue. Hence, the membership of the BASL was increased from by a signifacant number especially due to the new entrants to the legal profession.

During the past vear many programmes such as, certificate courses. Seminars, Symposiums, Provincial Law Conferences, Junior National Law Conferences were conducted throughout the country with the participation of many members. The funds generated out of the said programmes clearly strengthened the financial stability of the BASL. Accordingly, the BASL was able to improve the facilities at the secretariat wherein, many renovations were effected to the building. Further, the purchase of a generator and the installation of a Solar Power System at the secretariat would undoubtedly minimize the expenditure of the BASL in future.

It was concern of the management committee the defects in the BASL website. Hence various attempts were made to rectify such defects in consultation with the website developer. However, as there was no acceptable solution for the issues. steps were taken to launch a new website which is fully functional at present. In the meantime, steps have been initiated to institute legal proceedings to recover the monies paid to the website developer. Further. action plan has been initiated to set up a fully functional IT Department with the aid of USAID which work is currently in progress simultaneous to obtain wi-fi facility to the Secretariat.

I take great pride in placing on record, perhaps for the first time in the history, the BASL was able to reach the outstation Bars around the country and to provide immediate needs out of the funds so generated by the management committee. In the said context the BASL was able to provide computers, printers, furniture including chairs, tables, cupboards etc.. Sri Lanka New Law Reports. financial assistance for immediate renovations of libraries, donation of books etc. which have been highly appreciated by members. The details are set out in the Report.

The knowledge is the key for the legal profession. Accordingly, many programmes were organized such as, day seminars, provincial law conferences, labour symposium, junior national law conference, junior forum etc. with the participation of respected legal luminaries and experts in the respective areas of interest as recourse personnel to educate and to enhance the knowledge of our members. I am confident that the said

programmes were of immense of importance to all participants.

The BASL is well possessed of its obligations towards the society. Therefore, whilst rendering much assistance to citizens through the legal aid committee of the BASL throughout the year, an island wide legal assistance week under the name of 'law week 2019' was organized in the last year. During the said week, the legal aid clinics to general public, awareness programmes to school children, advice to general public from state and private sector organizations. education legal programmes. competitions among school children. prison visits, cleaning of court houses, free legal advice, assistance to general public from government offices including the Attornev General's Department and Sri Lanka Police and prison department, were carried out. I am happy to place on record that the said programme was highly acclaimed by all segments in the society. I shall appreciate with gratitude the immense support extended by the members of the Bar including the President's Counsels, officers of the official Bar. Sri Lanka Police. Prison Department. Ministry of Justice and the Government Departments who were the success behind the said programme.

One of the key issues that were discussed during the past year was the ever increasing new entrants which have deteriorated the standards of the legal professional. Further, much attention was drawn to the lack of supervision of the institutions involved in the legal education, such as private universities and institutions etc. Accordingly, the Committee appointed to study and make suitable recommendations to address the said matter, after deliberations with many stake holders submitted a detailed report. I am happy to place on record

that the recommendations of the said committee were accepted by the Council of Legal education visarvis the entry qualifications to Sri Lanka Law College, which is due to be implemented soon. The hard work of the members of the said committee is much appreciated.

We continue to educate the general public with regard to legal issues encountered in day today life through both print and electronic media. The success of the said programmes is amply demonstrated from the frequent responses received by the secretariat. We extend our sincere thanks to the members of the media committee for the efforts and especially obtaining sufficient air times from the respective media institutions without burdening the finances of the BASL.

It is important to educate the membership with regard to the latest developments of the law especially regarding the principals enunciated by the appellate courts in the respective judgments. We are happy to place on record that the BASL was able to commence the publication of the news letter with new features. The credit shall go to the editorial committee for the job well done. The BASL was able to publish many publications during the past year including the unreported judgments of the Supreme Court in the areas of both Civil and Criminal Law. The said publications have not only brought revenue to the BASL but have been a valuable legal literature for the legal practitioners. Further, steps have already been initiated to provide the complete set of Sri Lanka Law Reports and New Law Reports at a concessionary rate to the members.

Our juniors are the future of our legal profession. Hence, it is imperative for the BASL to provide required assistance and to create opportunity for the juniors to enhance knowledge and develop the skills simultaneous to maintain highest standards of professional ethics and to maintain professionalism throughout career. In this regard, the special programmes which were designed and held during the last year such as, Speech Craft Programme, Legal English Course, Effective Instructing Attorneys' Course, Junior National Law Conference and Junior Bar Forum, were of immense importance. The unreserved thanks are extended the iunior bar committee for the successful steps taken in organinsing the junior bar conference and the forum in the last year.

We were mindful of our obligations towards the legal profession and to the nation at large. Hence, whilst raising the voice of the Bar against the proposed amendments to the constitution of the Country and amendments to the existing laws. the BASL resorted to many courses of action including the filing of the application in Appellate Courts where we felt that the intervention of court was needed.. Further, an Application was filed in the Supreme Court against the Sri Lanka - Singapore free trade agreement in order to protect the best interest of the legal profession. We had mixed success in such attempts wherein some applications were determined in favour and some were against.

Relationships of the BASL must well managed. They must be established. maintained. strengthened and extended to ensure that the profession continues to benefit from a divers insights, shared capacity and innovation. We believe mutual benefit is essential. With the said intention BASL, during the past year maintained high rapport with the Judiciary, Ministry of Justice, Attorney General's Depart, Government Institutions, Private Sector Institutions and individuals wherein we were able

to resolve issues of mutual interest amicably as and when it were needed. Further, the horizons of the BASL were extended beyond the shores of the island. Accordingly, many delegations from other countries such as, Singapore, China, India and Australia were entertained at the Secretariat wherein full discussions were held to work harmoniously in the areas of mutual interest. The membership of Law Asia, International Bar Association continued whilst obtaining the membership of BRILA.

It is common knowledge that the BASL was criticized for the alleged lack of transparency in financial activities. Having considered the seriousness of the said matter, immediate steps were taken to recruit a qualified Accountant to manage the financial affairs of the secretariat.

There is no doubt that the ambiance of the secretariat is of importance. Accordingly, several steps were taken to renovate and upgrade the secretariat as aforesaid which could be witnessed by anyone at present. Iam firmly of the view the Secretariat of the BASL belongs to the membership. Thus, at all times the professionalism and discipline among the staff of the Secretariat and the services provided shall be of the highest standards. In this regard, steps were taken to introduce a dress code/uniform to the staff. Further, regular training programmes are conducted to the staff in order to meet ever increasing demands of the members and to be competitive. It is regrettable to note the non-availability of a proper system of recruitment to the staff, a proper code of ethics or list of duties which I consider as an impediment to provide a professional service to members. However, steps are being taken to remedy the said deficiencies.

I find that the detachment of senior members of the legal profession

from the affairs of the BASL has been an ever increasing concern of the management committee. This has undoubtedly impacted the affairs of the BASL as I am of the view, that the guidance of the seniors is imperative. Hence, necessary steps should be taken to create a conducive environment for the senior members to participate proactively in the affairs of the BASL in all capacities whilst, creating sufficient opportunities for the junior members of the Bar.

Upon a consideration of the increasing complaints against the attorneysat-law, which warrant merits, it has become necessary to revisit the existing rules and regulations relating to professional ethics and the mechanism in place to counter such incidents/complaints. Hence, it is imperative to introduce a proactive system to solve such complaints without delay in order to win the confidence of the general public. Simultaneous to the same, steps shall be taken to appraise the members with regard to professional ethics. It has been a concern during the past vear, the failure of the attorneys-atlaw to wear the proper attire to courts in compliance with the Supreme Court Rules. Hence, the BASL is in the process of taking meaningful steps to appraise the members regarding same.

There are many projects designed for the welfare of the members of the Bar, which are presently in the pipe line. Discussions are ongoing to provide health insurance schemes, retirement plans and loan schemes for juniors etc.

We noted the regular absence of several members of the executive committee, the Bar Council and Zonal representatives of the outstation bars from regular meetings. This would be an impediment for the affairs of the BASL. Thus, it is important to maintain

the enthusiasm throughout the year whilst appreciating the importance of the burden vested with the office of the representatives of the bar.

I wish to place on record my sincere appreciation for the unreserved support extended to me by the President Mr. U.R. De Silva, PC, the Deputy President, Mr.Ali Sabri, PC. Treasurer Mr.Sujeeva lal Dahanayake the Assistance secretary. Mr.Chamath Fernando during the past year. The President Mr.U.R.De Silva, PC undoubtedly receives special appreciation in view of the ability displayed during the past year without whom many programmes could not have been materialized.

Further, I wish to extend my sincere appreciation to His Lordship the Chief Justice, retired Chief Justice Hon. Priyasath Dep PC,the members of the Executive committee and the Bar Council, Senior and junior members of the Bar, Hon. Attorney General Mr.Jayantha Jayasooriya, PC, Hon. Solicitor General Dappula De Livera PC and the members of the Official Bar, Hon. Minister of Justice and the Secretary to the Ministry of Justice, Members of the Judiciary, for the support extended.

I also acknowledge with gratitude the support extended by the members of the BASL Secretariat led by Ms.Surani Samarasekera, the Administrative Secretary and the members of the Special Project Committee during the last year.

My sincere appreciations are extended to all the Chairman/Chairperson and the conveners of the sub committees for the year 2018/2019. The BASL would not have been able to carry out the respective programmes effectively and successfully if not for the support extended by them.

CHAPTER 03

- **Ceremonial Sittings**
- Farewell to His Lordship the 45th Chief Justice and Welcome Dinner for the 46th Chief Justice

During the last year several meetings were convened with the participation of the members of the Judiciary and Bar in order to identify and to find solutions for the issues faced by the members in the day today practice. It is worthy to note the outstation bench and bar meetings conducted at the respective Provincial Law conferences during the last year with the participation of his Lordship

Padman Suransena and the Honorable Attorney General undoubtedly was a success wherein the members of the outstation bars were able to find solutions for longstanding issues. The Management Committee of the BASL made use of the said meetings in order to identify the needs of the members of the outstation bars and accordingly we are happy to note that the BASL was able to provide much

assistance to the outstation bars which are mentioned in this report. Hence we consider that it is a necessity to continue the said bench and bar meetings in future which is of mutual benefit for both bench and the bar in administering justice.

Bench and Bar meeting held on O4TH September, 2018 at the District Court of Colombo.

A Bench and Bar meeting was held on 4th September 2018 at District Court Room No. 08 with a view to discuss the practical issues confronted by the legal practitioners, broadly categorized into three main areas namely Administration of the Judicial system, use of Technology in court procedures and Infrastructure in the District Courts, the Magistrates Courts. the Commercial High Courts. His Lordship the Chief Justice, Hon Attorney General, Secretary of the Ministry of Justice, Honorable Judges of the Commercial High Court, District Court and Magistrate Court took part in the deliberations on the invitation extended by the BASL.

His Lordship the Chief Justice spoke of several steps taken by the Judicial Service Commission towards automation of the Court System.

Some of the key concerns raised by the members at the solution-finding deliberation were

- I. Taking long time for recording the cases filed under Debt Recovery Law.
- II. The long interval between two successive dates of cases
- III. The Pre-Trial Procedure not achieving its nurnose
- IV. Delays incurred in obtaining certified copies of the proceedings

- V. The defects in the infrastructure such as seepage of rain water, poor safety condition of the court complex and lack of access for disabled to the Court Houses and accessory offices.
- VI. Failure to resort to advanced technology as a measure of countering the law delays.

Hon. District Judges of Colombo replied that the part of the law delays was attributable to the lack of infrastructure facilities. They further pointed out that having to handle vast number of cases by 10 judges had compelled the cases to be fixed between long intervals. Hence District Judges put forward following suggestions.

- I. Establishment of another District Court Room
- One Court house to be presided over by two judges separately in the morning and evening sessions.
- III. Establishment of separate Court Houses to take up Pre-Trial hearings.
- IV. Shortage of staff such as stenographers and clerks.

Secretary to the Ministry of Justice explained that plans are afoot to implement necessary renovation and refurbishments to the Court House and they were awaiting the funds requested for. He further commented that the

renovation of the Commercial High Courts would be completed within this year with the support of Sri Lanka Navy.

Mr. U.R de Silva, the President of the BASL emphasized the acceleration of the moves to facilitate E- Filing, Case Management and audio and video recording

Adverting to Colombo Law Library which is the largest law library in the country having nearly 15,000 books it was pointed out that though water and electricity were provided by the Ministry all other facilities were maintained by themselves. Law library uses 6,400 sq.ft area and other 5.000 sq. ft feature a consulting room, ladies room and the canteen. It was further bemoaned that the 5,600 sq.ft which was believed to have been allocated for the Law Library on the proposed new building to house entire court complex was not adequate therefore urged the Secretary of MOJ to re-visit the space earmarked for that purpose.

All the stake holders who attended the event made their candid observations on the steps to be taken to upgrade the Court System.

CEREMONIAL SITTINGS

During the last year, several Ceremonial sittings were held in the Supreme Court as well as in the Court of Appeal. There were representation at the said Ceremonial sittings by the BASL wherein inter alia the President of the BASL, from time to time

highlighted the need of speedy action to be taken to address the allegation of Laws' delays. Further, the President expressed his concerns regarding the lack of discipline among the legal practitioners in the recent years and called upon the intervention of the members of both the bench and the bar to take steps to maintain the Professional standards especially in the eyes of the general public.





THE FUTURE OF LEGAL EDUCATION COMMITTEE

The influxion of high number of entrants to the legal profession has drawn serious concerns of all stakeholders in the legal profession. Thereof, a special committee was appointed by the BASL to propose suitable recommendations to address the said concerns specially due to the reasons of high number of entrants on yearly basis has really contribute, inter alia, to lower the standers of the legal profession. The comprehensive report compiled by aforesaid committee after much deliberation over a period of one year, made several recommendations, specially based on the proposals made by members of the judiciary, members of the official and unofficial Bar, both senior and junior members. Having considered the said recommendation during the past year, several discussions were held by BASL and the members of the said committee with his Lordship the Chief Justice and members of the Council of Legal Education. I am happy to note that the efforts of the BASL, specially said committee Mr. Ali Sabry PC, our deputy President the recommendation vis vis the entrants to the law collage was approved by the Council of Legal Education.

Therefore, several progressive proposals made by the BASL were accepted by the Council of Legal Education in that minimum qualification to seek entrance to Sri Lanka Law Collage, acceptance of foreign law degrees, the recognition of the law education universities/institutions, and medium of instructions and curriculum at the law collage will be regulated and implemented.

Our sincere gratitude is extended to Mr. Ali Sabry PC and the abled members of the committee who worked tirelessly for a long period for the benefit of the future generation and the betterment of the legal profession. We unreservedly extend our thanks to all resource persons who contributed many ways to the committee in its endeavors.

CONCLUSION

The Future of Legal education Committee in identifying the need to enhance the standards of legal education in Sri Lanka, addresses and reviews several core areas of concern in the existing legal education framework. The Committee in consultation with senior members of the profession and the stakeholders of legal education has proposed practical recommendations which could be implemented through,

- Regulating the pathways to become an Attorney-at-Law in Sri Lanka and implementation of a 'Minimum Criteria for Entry' into the Law College of Sri Lanka
- b. Regulating entry of Foreign Graduates into the Law College of Sri Lanka.
- Regulation, Supervision and improving the standards of Legal Education in the Sri Lanka Law College
- d. Implementation of Continuous Professional Development (CPD)
- e. Amending the Regulatory framework to facilitate the recommendations.

For the purpose of successfully implementing the proposed recommendations, and enhancing the standards of legal education and the profession, this Committee is of the view that a dedicated Steering Committee should be established to regularly monitor the progress and to work with the stakeholders of the legal profession to ensure that the recommendations be implemented.

The Steering Committee in conjunction with the ICLE and other stakeholders shall identify and categorize the implementation of short-term, medium-term and long-term schemes. The appointment of several sub-committees under different headings with specific mandates and timeline in order to meet these obligations is recommended.

Furthermore, we recommend that a 5 year grace period be given for the implementation of the said schemes, particularly regarding the foreign graduate entry path, in order to avoid detriment to those who have already commenced on a course of legal study with the expectation that they will be subject to the same procedures as their predecessors.

The entire roadmap of this Report ought to be subjected to periodic review and reassessment, to keep abreast with the developing needs in the framework of legal education in Sri Lanka. Thus, the Committee on the Future of Legal Education is pleased to conclude this Report and we hope that the fruits of our labour will be a catalyst for change in taking both the legal education and the legal profession of the nation to greater heights.

We at the Sri Lanka Bar Association are committed and will to continue to support and assess any endeavor taken to upgrade and modernise legal education to keep up with international standards.




National Labour Law Symposium

Debt Recovery Workshop




The day Seminar conducted at Homagama

The Human Rights Committee of the Bar Association of Sri Lanka together with the Welfare Division of Prison Department conducted a legal Counseling Programme for the male and female convicted/remand prisoners in September 2018 at the Magazine Remand Prison and Welikada Prison.

Chairman of the Human Rights Committee of the BASL delivered the Introductory Remarks and the Prison Chief Welfare Officer also addressed the inmates.

A team of Ten Lawyers participated and conducted Counseling Sessions for the male and female inmates on a one on one basis to inquire into whether there were any violation of their rights during the police custody or at the Prison.



REPORT OF THE APPRENTICES TRAINING COMMITTEE

In most of the countries, Apprenticeship lasts for at least two years where Apprentices gain extensive legal practice experience prior to becoming a lawyer to competently represent one's clients upon being enrolled in the bar. During this period Apprentices are expected to learn how to put their knowledge into practice and are also expected to learn the court ethics and etiquettes, legal tactics, how to work under pressure, etc.

However, in Sri Lanka, the Apprenticeship lasts only for six months and most of the Apprentices are called to the Bar before they acquire even the minimum level of skills.

In this light, the Bar Association having identified the issue has as the initial step designed an apprenticeship training program organized and monitored by the Apprenticeship Training Committee. The first training program was successfully held on the O3rd of September 2018 at Hotel Monarch in Thalawathugoda and the second of which was held at the same venue on the 10th of February 2019. At the first program I delivered a lecture on "Duties and Responsibilities of A Notary" and at the second program I delivered a lecture on "Duties and Obligations of an Attorney-at-Law".

I as the Chairman of the Apprenticeship Training Committee also delivered following lectures namely;

- 1. "Law related to Interim Injunctions" at the Eastern Provincial Law Conference held in Trincomalee
- 2. "Pre-Trial Procedure" at the special lecture held at the Bar Association Auditorium Colombo on the Amendments to the Civil Procedure Code.
- 3. "A role of an Instructing Attorney" at the Apprenticeship Program organized by the Law College in Colombo.
- 4. "Role of an Instructing Attorney in the Pre-trial process" at a lecture organized by the Sri Lanka Women Lawyers Association in Colombo.
- 5. "Duties and obligations of a Notary in executing a deed" at the Southern Provincial Law Conference held in Galle.
- 6. "Condominium Law and Issues related to the Notarial Practice" at the BASL CLE Program in Kurunegala.

REPORT OF THE NOTARIAL PRACTICE (NP) & REGISTRATION OF TITLE (ROT) COMMITTEE

Mr. Nithi Murugesu, Attorney-at-Law was appointed as Chairman of the NPC Committee and the Registration of Title Committee.

Ms. Nirodha Kalansooriya, Attorney-at-Law was appointed as the Convener of the NPC Committee and the Registration of Title Committee.

Meetings of the Committee

These two committees had their monthly committee meetings at the BASL premises on the days the Bar Council meet, from 9.00 A.M. onwards. Due to several important Notarial and Title Registration matters to be considered urgently, these committees convened several additional committee meetings.

Payment of Stamp Duty for Deeds/Instruments

Several Lawyers who are Notaries made representations to the BASL for assistance. These included Lawyers from the Gampaha, Avisawella and several other Bars relating to delay/ nonpayment of stamp duty and possible prosecutions and fines. NPC together with delegates of BASL had a meeting with the Western Province Commissioner to discuss the possibility of resolving the matter. The Western Province Provincial Council and the Commissioner of Revenue were reluctant to grant any relief to the said Lawyers and therefore the NPC requested those Lawyers to make an appeal pointing out the provisions which give them the right to appeal.

Meeting had with Hon. Minister of Home Affairs and several meetings had with the Registrar General

The representative of the NPC had a meeting with the Hon. Minister, the Registrar General and some Land Registrars to discuss several issues including the change of Notarial License to "Districts" rather than "Judicial Zones/Divisions" which has given rise to certain practical difficulties. NPC also requested consequent amendments to these relevant enactments.

The (NPC) requested the Registrar-General to improve the services and facilities for their staff and for Lawyers / Notaries in the Land Registries and to be cooperative with Lawyers. Several issues relating to the registration of Deeds at Land Registries were also discussed. The Registrar General agreed to provide solutions to most of these requests.

The Registrar General mentioned that registration of deeds will be done within one day (one-day service) at Rs 5,000/=. However, the NPC requested not to implement this service as it affects prior registrations. This service has been suspended.

A Full Day Conference on "Conveyancing and Notarial Practice" held at BMICH.

A full day Conference was held on 9th February 2019 at the BMICH with 450 participants and it was very successfully concluded. The Chairperson of the Conference Committee was Mrs. Chandra Ellawella, Attorney at Law. The topics covered were "Property Transfers and Anti money Laundering requirements" by Dr. Dayanath Jayasooriya PC, "Implications of new Foreign Exchange law on Property Transfers and Migration allowances" by Mr. Ravindra Jayarathne, Director Foreign Exchange CBSL, Realization of Assets Tax (Capital Gains Tax) and other taxes under the new tax regime" by Mr. Suresh, Attorney-at-Law, Director Tax Regulatory KPMG, "Salient Features in the Notaries and Registration of Documents, Reconstruction of damaged folios, Foreign wills and re sealing foreign probates" by Mr. G. G. Arulpragasam, Attorney-at-Law, "Amalgamation of Subdivision of properties and Approval of plans" by Engineer Ms. K. G. Samarasinghe, Acting Director (City Planning), Colombo Municipal Council, "Revocation of irrevocable Deeds and Gifts and Advice to Notaries to avoid pitfalls" by Mr. Chandana Liyanapatabendi PC, Fraudulent Land Transactions by Mr. Neville Abeyrathne PC, "Salient Features of the Title Registration Act from the owner's, Notaries and Counsel's perspective, Crown and Swarna Boomi Lands" by Ms. Keerthimala Gunesekera, Attorney-at-Law and "Current Apartment Ownership laws and Management Corporations" by Ms. Ajithaa Edirimane, Attorney-at-Law

Report of the Chairman - Professional Purposes Committee

I was appointed as the Chairman of the Professional Purposes Committee of the Bar Association of Sri Lanka to oversee the complaints made and allegations leveled against Attorneys-at-Law and to adjudicate justice.


Over the years I have seen reputed members of the bar being subjected to humiliation by calling for explanations and / or disciplinary inquiry on frivolous complaints. Thereby, I initiated a two pronged system where first the complaints are screened by the Chairman of the Professional Purposes Committee to ascertain the genuineness and merits of complaints received and thereafter will be referred to a panel if in the Chairman's opinion the complaint is genuine and have merits prima-facie.

I have received hundred and eight (108) complaints against Attorneys-at-Law during the past year which is a slight reduction compared to the previous year and a majority of the complaints are in relation to conveyancing and professional misconduct matters which constitute approximately fifty (50) per centum of the total complaints received. I have also received seventeen (17) complaints in relation forgery and fraudulent acts by lawyers and thirty nine complaints pertaing to other acts of misconduct.


I have looked into all matters referred to me and given necessary instructions. Accordingly, I have recommended referring five [01] complaint together with inquiry panel rulings to His Lordship the Chief Justice to take appropriate steps. I have also recommended dismissing thirty two [32] complaints that is thirty [30] per centum of the total complaints received due to lack of genuineness and/or merits and/or jurisdiction. I have also recommended calling for explanation from sixty six [66] Attorneys-at-Law with regard to complaints received against them and recommended to fix sixty three [63] of them for inquiry.

I believe it is of paramount importance to expedite the adjudication process as our profession will lose its nobility very soon if we fail to and / or neglect to take necessary steps in addressing the complaints received and allegations leveled against Lawyers.

Professional Ethics is an integral part of this noble profession. It was the view of many, that annual influx of lawyers into this profession without any quality control has sent this profession into a descending trend. The ethics committee which comprised of;

commenced their tenure in 2017 and discharged assigned matters which were at a stand-still for two years. The Committee met on weekends on regular basis and due to the efficiency of the same, certain professional purpose inquiry matters were also entrusted with the Ethics Committee.

In discharging ethics issues, the committee took every inquiry very seriously and concluded such inquires in a highly professional manner. The following is the schedule of work that was completed during the current year. Though many expressed concern that younger generation does not follow the rule of law and have less regard for professional ethics, the committee felt otherwise as 90% of the matters were pertaining to complaints against lawyers who are above 10 years in practice.

The above clearly indicates the deterioration of Professional standards amongst the legal practitioners which needs to be addressed without delay. It is considered that stern action shall be taken against the members who are found guilty for Professional misconduct in order to maintain the Public confidence in the legal system. In this context the attention should be drawn to set up a mechanism to conduct disciplinary enquiries in Provincial levels which would undoubtedly expedite the conclusion of such enquiries which will be beneficial for both the Public and the respective Respondents. This would be beneficial for the legal fraternity in winning the Public confidence and trust but of course such enquiries shall be conducted in an impartial, independent, and a transparent manner by following due process.



New Attire for women lawyers (Optional)

Considering the representation made by the women lawyers, the BASL initiated discussion with his Lordship the Chief Justice. Accordingly, the following Gazette Notification was published wherein the optional attire was permitted as a dress code for women lawyers. However, concerns have been raised that said rules relating to attire must be revisited and suitable steps should be taken to avoid criticism regarding the attire of Attorneys –At-Law.

SUPREME COURT RULES - 2018

RULES made under Article 136 of the Constitution of the Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka by the Chief Justice and the other Judges of the Supreme Court nominated by him under that Article.

- 1. W. P. G. Dep, Chief Justice
- 2. S. E. Wanasundera, Judge of the Supreme Court
- 3. B. P. Aluwihare, Judge of the Supreme Court
- 4. K. S. J. de Abrew, Judge of the Supreme Court.

Colombo,

1. These rules may be cited as the Attire of Judges and Attorneys-at-Law Rules of 2018. These rules amend the Attire of Judges and Attorneys-at-Law Rules 1978 by deletion of Rule 7 and substitution of new rule thereof and shall come into force on such date as may be appointed by the Chief Justice by Notification published in the *Gazette*.

Amendment to the Attire of Judges and Attorneys-at-Law Rules 1978 by the deletion of Rule 7 and Substitution of a new rule

7. The attire of women Attorneys-at-Law shall be as follows:




BASL - Facelift to Infrastructure and Facilities

During the past year several discussions were held among the Hon. Chief Justice, Judicial Service Commission, Ministry of Justice and Attorney General's Department with the BASL. The areas of discussions were mainly concentrated upon the improvement of infrastructure facilities in the court systems throughout the country and to amend the respective laws to meet the present day demands. Further, meaningful steps were taken to address the issue of overcrowding the prisons and the delay in obtaining the Hon. Attorney General's advice on matters which are pending in Court. I am happy to note and appreciate with gratitude the support extended by all officers referred to above during the year under review which has immensely contributed to solve such issues without delay.

However, the areas such as, the renovation of court houses especially in Colombo, inadequate facilities for litigants including differently able persons in respective courts are matters which need immediate attention. Further, the improvements in the respective registries of Magistrates Court to the Supreme Court too need immediate attention. The implementation of the proposal to digitalize the court system along with the matters referred to above would be essential to win the confidence in the legal system and to avoid the alleged laws delays.

Establishment of a Branch Office of American Bar Association in Sri Lanka

I write with reference to your letter dated 22/10/2018 received on 25th October, 2018.

By your letter dated 06/04/2013, you requested our observations with regard to the establishment of a branch association of the American Bar Association as a NGO in Sri Lanka.

Thereafter, the US Department of State Office by its letter dated 15° June, 2018 informed us of their reconfirmation that American Bar Association Rule of Law Initiative (ABA ROLI) was selected as the implementing partner of the U.S. Department of State, Office to Monitor and Combat Trafficking in Persons (J/TIP), to carry out the "Combating in Trafficking in Persons in Sri Lanka" Project (February 2018

– July 2019) in close collaborati-in with the Government of Sri Lanka. It also states that the program will
be in close collaboration with Sri Lanka government and civil society partners including the Bar Association of Sri Lanka.

We wish to reiterate that in 2018, the Bar Association of Sri Lanka conducted a program on "Combating Trafficking in Persons" with the support of American Bar Association Rule of Law Initiative which was rated as highly successful. Similar programs have been conducted in collaboration with the American Bar Association, over the past 4 - 5 years namely, Anti-corruption and Internet Freedom

We wish to further state that these programs were well accepted by the target communities and achie the objectives of the said programs in no small measure.

Hence, we do not see the need no register a legal entity in order to conduct similar programs in Sri Lanka. The Bar Association will be glad to co-operate with the ABA on these lines in the future and maintain the excellent relationship between our two Associations already established in the preceding years.



CHAPTER 13

INDEPENDENCE OF THE JUDICIARY AND PROTECTION OF RULE OF LAW



SINGAPORE – SRI LANKA FTA AGREEMENT FR ACTION

In considering dire consequences of the provisions of the FTA signed between the Government of Sri Lanka and Singapore, after deliberations, a Fundamental Rights application was filed before the Lordships of the Supreme Court. The said case is presently pending in court.

ISSUE OF CHINESE COMPANY PROVIDING LEGAL SERVICES

The BASL took serious note of the issue relating to the providing of legal services by non-members of the Bar especially non-Sri Lankans, in Sri Lanka. Accordingly, in consequent to a decision arrived at by the Executive Committee and the Bar Council, steps are being taken to find an appropriate redress in order to safeguard the best interests of the legal profession.

BASL PARTICIPATION / SUPPORT IN NATIONAL ISSUES

- 1. Luncheon Meeting for discussion on first draft of the "Sustainable Sri Lanka Progress relating to the Vision" Document held on 8th September 2018 at the Presidential Secretariat.
- 2. Breakfast meeting with ITC / Department of Commerce on an Invitation from the EU-Sri Lanka Trade-Related Assistance Project on the subject of trade remedies / defensive measures for legal professionals who specialize on international trade law and investment dispute and arbitration on Monday 8th October 2018 at Jetwing Colombo.
- 3. BASL supported National Authority on Victims and Witness Protection by nominating Lawyers to appear for Victims and Witnesses on pro bono service. Negombo bar Supported in this activity.

BASL AGAINST MP RAMANAYAKE

The BASL is committed to preserve the dignity and the prestige of the Legal Profession both intrinsically and extrinsically. Accordingly, the BASL in pursuance of organizational objectives, instantaneously defensively came forward when MP Ranjan Ramanayake made derogatory remarks on public media describing the entire legal system as corrupt. The BASL, after taking cognizance of the matter urgently, immediately issued a press release on 23rd August 2017 condemning such statement as having been based on mere conjecture and surmises. Further, on the recommendation of Executive Meeting followed by the endorsement of Bar Council, BASL instituted a rule matter bearing Number 1/2017 before the Supreme Court against MP Ramanayake over Contempt of Court. The said rule Matter is now progressing before Supreme Court with the BASL diligently prosecuting the said rule matter with a view to reveal the truth to the society.

PRESS STATEMENT BY THE BAR ASSOCIATION OF SRI LANKA

The Executive Committee of the Bar Association, which met on the 23rd of August 2017, unanimously resolved, inter alia, to condemn the recent statement made by Deputy Minister Ranjan Ramanayake alleging that a majority of the judges and lawyers were corrupt and was the main cause for the country's present predicament.

Whilst condemning the said statement, we demand the Deputy Minister to complain against any corrupt person to the relevant authorities, including the Judicial Service Commission, Police and the Bribery Commission, with a view to take necessary action if he has evidence to establish such allegations instead of making generalized statements casting aspersions on the entire judiciary and the legal community.

Due to the gravity of the disparaging statement concerned the Executive Committee of the Bar Association of Sri Lanka is compelled to institute Contempt of Court Proceedings against the said Deputy Minister in the Supreme Court of the Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka, under Article 105 (3) of the Constitution of the Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka for bringing the judiciary into disrespect and disrepute.

The Bar Association reiterates that, it is an imperative requirement for a democratic society founded upon the Rule of law to preserve protect and safeguard the independence of the Judiciary.

The Constitution of our Country makes specific provision in this regard, since, the ability to impart justice together with the law enforcement authorities being able to carry out duties without fear, favour or undue influence being brought upon them politically or otherwise is sine qua non of a functional democracy.

In the circumstances, any unwarranted remarks and interference with regard to the judicial mechanism and its credibility will erode the confidence the public has towards the establishment. This in turn would have serious consequences on the Rule of Law.

RULE MATTER AGAINST MR. NAGANANDA KODITHUWAKKU AAL

The BASL in its endeavor to defend the supremacy of law jealously guarded by Bench and Bar equally do not hesitate to turn hostile to any member of the Bar who is engaged in slinging malice at the Bench and Bar. Accordingly when Supreme Court issued a rule bearing Number 1/16 against Mr. Nagananda Kodituwakku AAL over his contemptuous behavior at Court of Appeal before His Lordship Justice Vijith K Malalgoda, the Bar Association of Sri Lanka, in condemnation of such unbecoming behavior of him, made intervention in support of the said rule matter. Following a hearing on 18th March 2019 Supreme Court found Mr. Kodituwakku guilty of the charge described in the said rule and imposed three years suspension from the legal profession. The reaction of the BASL against its own member is widely acclaimed as manifestation of the independence in the BASL.

This is further to our e mail communique dated 28.03.2018 and to your purported response dated 30.04.2018.

At the outset, we categorically deny and dispute the ålleged contents of your purported communications and the said alleged contents thereof are ex facie devoid of any merit, are false and are false to your knowledge.

Whilst reiterating the contents of our previous communique, we wish to remind you that you are an accused of two rule matters pending before their Lordship's of the Supreme Court. You being an Attomey-at-Law of the Supreme Court, are aware that you are bound and obliged to comply with the rules and regulations of the Supreme Court which you have acted in breach and/or in violation.

It is quite obvious from the alleged contents of your purported communications, you are seeking for popularity by dubious means to suit your standards and requirements which the Bar Association of Sri Lanka is unable to report to.

We wish to inform you that at all times material, the President of the Bar Association has discharged the duties based on the mandate given by the membership and in compliance with the provisions of the constitution which actions have not be an upprovided to the publicative

JUDICATURE ACT (AMENDMENT) BILL

The BASL as a defender of the rights of the people challenged the Judicature (Amendment) Bill, No. 26 of 2017 by which it had been sought to amend the Judicature Act, No. 2 of 1978 by providing for setting up a Permanent Trial-at-Bar to expedite the large amount of pending cases. The BASL resorting to challenge the constitutionality of the said Bill argued that should the bill be passed, it would vest unusual power in the Attorney General and the Director General of the Bribery Commission on the selection of the cases to be referred to said Court, which would in turn infringe the Constitution of Sri Lanka.

Upholding the submissions put forth on behalf of the BASL, the Supreme Court determined the Judicature Amendment Bill needed to be passed with a two third majority as certain clauses therein was found to have been inconsistent with the provisions of the Constitution. The determination of the Supreme Court was announced in Parliament on 3rd April 2008.

In the said determination the Supreme Court had determined that section 12A(1) of the Bill and was inconsistent with the Article 154P (3) (a) of the Constitution and an amendment was required to be made to the Constitution to give effect to the section 12A(1) of the Bill. Further the amending section 12A(2) of the Bill which had required the Judicial Service Commission to nominate judges to the Permanent High Court at Bar was held to have been inconsistent with the Article 154(P)2 of the Constitution, hence warranting the Bill to be passed with Two Third Majority with a referendum. Also the amending section 12(A)(7) of the Bill was observed to have been inconsistent with Article 12(1) of the Constitution. However, the Supreme Court determined if the Chief Justice was given the power to decide whether to hold a trial at Bar or not this amending section would cease to be inconsistent.

The independence of the Judiciary and the Bar is an integral part of the Administration of Justice. The undue interference by anyone should not be tolerated under any circumstance whatsoever. It is in this context many steps were taken by the BASL as reflected in the communications set out herein below.

BASL CONDEMNS WIMAL'S STATEMENT ON SC APPOINTME

The Bar Association of Sri Lanka (BASL) while deploring a statement made by Wimal Weerawansa MP on the recent appointment to the Supreme Court said if the MP had made the statements outside Parliament, the BASL would have without any hesitation called for him to be dealt with for Contempt of Court in terms of the law.

The BASL statement: Bar Association of Sri Lanka unequivocally and strongly condemns the speech made by Member of Parliament Wimal Weerawansa in Parliament on January 10, 2019 wherein he made derogatory remarks about the Supreme Court of Sri Links, "During the course of a speech during the debate on a Bill, was age

Hon, Weerawansa stated that "the Supreme Court has become a den for a cer-tain religious sect." In the course of speech Mr. Weerawansa alleged that the Constitutional Council had approved only the names of persons from a certain religious sect for appointments to the Supreme Court. When appointments to the Supreme Court over the last few years are considered it is clear that Weerawansa's statements are baseless and devoid of truth:

"The aforesaid words of Weerawansa have effect of interfering with the independence of the Judiciary of this country. The Bar Association of Sri Lanka stresses that the race and religion of members of the Judiciary should not be used to unfairly attack the

Judiciary. Whilst members of the public including politicians are entitled to criticise the Judiciary in a reasonable and objective manner, they are not entitled to cast aspersions on the Judiciary in such a manner as to bring the Court into disrepute. Such attacks impinge on the independence of the Judiciary and the Rule of Law.

"It is regrettable that Weerawansa has made this speech in Parliament under cover of privilege, preventing him from being dealt with by the laws of contempt. Had this speech been made outside Parliament, the Bar Association of Sri Lanka would have without any hesitation called for him to be dealt with for Contempt of Court in terms of the law".

He said, though she had made such a remark, she had not complained to the BASL about such incidents.


Mr. de Silva said the BASL had written to Ms Fernando on April 26, informing her it would take necessary legal action against the wrongdoers

"We do not say that any of the officers are perfect. But criticizing everyone at random can lead to a collapse in the jurisdiction and the rule of law," he said.



RE: Issues face by Lawyers at Land Registries

We are informed by Lawyers in writing who engage in Notarial practice that they face several issues at Land registries including below listed matters.

(i) Performance of Delkanda Land Registry is adversely affected by the space issue . Non - availability of parking space anywhere close to Delkanda land Registry is causing lot of inconvenience to Notaries as well as public and has to be shifted to another place;

(ii) Homagama Land Registry is on the 4th Floor of the building without lift facilities which causes inconvenience for elderly Notaries from attending that Land Registry;

(iii)Gampaha Land Registry requests Notaries to present themselves on Fridays to rectify errors and that all the Notaries converge at the Land Registry on that day and the Registry does not even have seating facilities.

(iv) There is no uniformity of the procedure at Land Registries regarding Title Registration process

(v) Filling the vacancy created by the retirement of the Registrar General last year by appointing a suitable person who has knowledge and experience in the relevant field.

(vi) Land Registry officials mainly at Colombo are very corrupt and accept bribes to expedite the Registration of Deeds. Hence, the Bribery Commission Department should be requested to use a decoy and apprise the officials of the Land Registries that the Bribery Commission is keeping the Land Registries under observation.

TREASURER'S REPORT



It is my pleasure to present the Audited Statements of Accounts and the Financial Statement of the Bar Association of Sri Lanka for the year 2018, the Second Year in succession for the approval of the Bar Council.

My two years as Treasurer were spent working hard towards achieving our strategic objectives of being more efficient, focusing on competency and enhancing transparency. The format of the Financial Information and Accounting Policies are unchanged from previous years.

As the Treasurer, I have always worked diligently to position the BASL to better respond to change and the challenging issues affecting us all with the membership paramount. I have been fortunate to work with thoughtful and dedicated fellow members, supported by committed staff and relying on the generous volunteerism of many in the legal profession.

MEMBERSHIP SUBSCRIPTIONS

During the period under review, we collected a sum of Rs.878,500/- as Ordinary Membership and a sum of Rs.8,880,000/- as Life Membership.

FIXED DEPOSITS

In order to derive a higher interest rate, a sum of Rs. 7,900,000/- from Life Membership Subscriptions was deposited in Fixed Deposits with the approval of the Executive Committee.

During the period under review, Fixed Deposits were increased from a sum of Rs.113,530,750/- to Rs.121,430,749.01

INCOME FROM THE BASL BOOKSHOP

The BASL recorded a profit of Rs.524,581.11 being the commission on sale of the books, publications and stationery sold at the BASL Bookshop during the period

under review. I am pleased to mention that the payments on sale of consignment books were made to the authors with the least possible delays.

PURCHASE OF FIXED ASSETS

During the period under review, Fixed Assets purchased for Rs. 2,745,167.87 include purchasing of tiles and fittings for bathrooms of BASL Building, Furniture Items for BASL Programme Committee Room, Air Conditioner to the BASL Library, Tables and Chairs for the Restaurant at the High Court Premises of Colombo, Roller Blinds to the BASL Auditorium, Name Board of the BASL and Tea Machine etc.

LOANS GRANTED TO BASL STAFF

Staff Loans were granted to two staff members

BASL STAFF SALARIES

As approved by the EXCO, the staff salaries were increased during the period under review. Additional amount of Rs.72,788/- per month will incur for this purpose.

PROFIT FROM SALE OF BASL DIARIES 2019

Diary Committee was able to make a profit of Rs.3,544,112/- from the sale of Diaries of 2019.

REFURBISHMENT WORK AND REPAIRS DONE TO BASL BUILDING

During the period under review, despite the financial challenges, the BASL embarked on ambitious project to refurbish the BASL Lunch Room, Administrative Section, BASL Projects Committee Section on the 2nd Floor. After lapse of several years, section of the BASL Building and toilets were repaired. Book shop, Library and the entire BASL building was clour washed.

PURCHASING A GENERATOR

In the event of a prolonged power blackout, it was a long felt requirement to purchase a generator. As approved by the Bar Council, a generator costing Rs. 2,689,925/-was purchased.

INSTALLING SOLAR PANELS

As approved by Bar Council, solar panels were purchased by obtaining a loan of Rs.7,950,000/- against the Fixed Deposits held with HNB -Hulftsdorp Branch.

At present , the average monthly electricity bill is Rs.175,000/- and the monthly loan installment to be paid to HNB for the Solar Panels is. Rs.228,500/ (Capital Cost - Rs.133,500/ and Interest -approximately Rs.95,000/-) for 5 years. The cost benefits of converting to a solar panel system will be effected only after the payment of loan in full.

STAFF UNIFORMS

Each staff member was given 3 sets of uniforms in 3 different colours, costing Rs.216.000/ for 23 staff members

DONATIONS PROVIDED TO OUTSTATION BARS

As practiced in the past, donations amounting to Rs.215,550/- were provided to the following bars at their request.

NOTES TO FINANCAIL STATEMENTS

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST DECEMBER 2018

1. General Information

The principal place of business of the Bar Association of Sri Lanka (The Association") is located at No.153, Mihindu Mawatha, Colombo 12.

The objective of the Association is to maintain the honour and independence of the in Sri Lanka, promotion of good relationships and co-operating consideration of matters of national importance, maintenance of standards of professional conduct or the Bar.

The financial statements of the association for the year ended 31st December 2018 were authorized for issued by the Executive Committee on 20th March, 2018.

2. Basis of Preparation and Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

The financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis and in compliance with the Sri Lanka Accounting Standard for Small and Medium-sized Entities (SLFRS for SMEs) laid down by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of Sri Lanka. All values presented in the financial statements are in Sri Lanka Rupees (Rs.) rounded to the nearest rupee. The measurement basis used is the historical cost basis except where otherwise stated in the accounting policies below.

2.1. Income and Expenditure Recognition

2.1.1. Income Recognition

Membership Fees/ Subscriptions

Subscription income is accounted on a cash basis.

Life membership fee transferred to capital reserve account.

Income from Activities/Projects

Income from various other activities is recognized on an accrual basis.

Specific Funds

Auditorium grants are recognized in the income statement over a period of five years.

Investment Income

Investment income consists of interest received from fixed deposits recognized on accrual basis.

Rental Income

Rental income from the premises is recognized on a straight-line basis over the respective lease terms and is included in "other income".

2.1.2 Expenditure Recognition

Expenses are recognized in the statement of comprehensive income on the basis of a direct association between the cost incurred and the earning of specific items of income. All expenditure incurred in the running of the Association and in maintaining the property, plant and equipment in a state of efficiency has been charged to income in arriving at the net income for the year.

2.2 Income Taxes

The Association has not provided for the income tax liability as required by the Act No.10 of 2006 and amendment thereto.

2.3 Property, plant and equipment including investment property measured at cost

Furniture and equipment are stated in the statement of financial position at their Re-valued amounts, being the fair value at the date of revaluation, less any subsequent accumulated depreciation. Any revaluation increase arising on the revaluation of furniture and equipment is credited to equity.

Upon disposal of a revalue property and equipment, any corresponding revaluation surplus remaining is transferred to retained earnings.

Land given by the Government of Sri Lanka has not been valued and taken to the financial statements.

Building is stated at historical cost and ground floor has been rented to earn rental income. However this floor has not been accounted for as investment property since the fair value of such floor cannot be measured reliably without undue cost or effort.

Freehold land and building is not depreciated. For all other assets depreciation is charged so as to allocate the cost of assets less their residual values over their estimated useful lives, using the straight-line method at 15% per annum.

2.4 Financial Instruments

2.4.1 Trade and Other Receivables

Trade and other receivables are initially recognized at the transaction price. All income is made on the basis of normal credit terms, and the receivables do not bear interest. At the end of each reporting period, the carrying amounts of trade and other receivables are reviewed to determine whether there is any objective evidence that the amounts are not recoverable. If so, an impairment loss is recognized immediately in profit or loss.

Financial liabilities are initially recognized at the transaction price (including transaction costs). Trade payables are obligations on the basis of normal credit terms and do not bear interest.

2.4.2 Inventories

Inventories are stated at cost or net realizable value whichever is lower. Net realizable value is the price at which inventories can be sold in the ordinary course of the business less estimated costs of sales.

2.5 Defined Benefit Plan - Gratuity

Gratuity is a defined benefit plan. In order to meet this liability, a provision is carried forward in the statement of financial position. The provision is calculated considering half month salary in to the number of completed years.

However, as per the Payment of Gratuity Act No. 12 of 1983, the liability arises only upon the completion of five years of continuous service.

2.6 Defined Contribution Plan - EPF & ETF

A defined contribution plan is a post-employment benefit plan under which an entity pays fixed contributions into a separate entity and will have no legal or constructive obligation to pay further amounts. Obligations for contributions to defined contribution plans are recognized as an employee benefit expense in the income statement as in the periods during which services are rendered by employees.

Employees' Provident Fund

The association and employees contribute 12% and 8% respectively on the salary of each employee to the approved Provident Fund.

Employees' Trust Fund

The association contributes 3% of the salary of each employee to the Employees' Trust Fund.

2.7 Significant accounting judgments estimates and assumptions

The preparation of the financial statements of the Association require management to make judgments, estimates and assumptions that effect the reported amounts of revenue, expenses, assets and liabilities and the disclosure of contingent liabilities at the reporting date. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

Commitments and Contingencies

There were no material commitments and contingencies as at the date of the statement of financial position.

2.8 Events after the end of the Reporting Period

There were no significant events after the reporting date that require adjustments to or disclosure in the interim financial statements.
